On January 25th, we were honored to receive a generous donation of \$1000 from the WVU Equine Studies Program for our Adopt a Day/Week program and the Rosenbaum Family House Care & Comfort Fund. Thanks to the entry



fees collected during the program's Ugly Christmas Sweater Horse Show held in December, they were able to raise enough money to adopt a week. This donation will provide support for families by paying for their room balance.

Continuing our partnership with WVU Equine Studies Program Brandon Cook, associate director of development at the Rosenbaum Family House, and Crystal Smith are discussing bringing guests to the Ugly Christmas Sweater Horse Show scheduled for December this year. Additionally, they plan to add a new component to the next show which will allow WVU organizations to visit the J.W. Ruby Research, Education and Outreach Center to make stuffed horses for children at WVU Medicine. "Some of our guests are long-term guests who are there for months at a time," Cook said. "This donation has sparked a partnership between us, and it's one that will benefit our guests tremendously."

Project Rainbow's Rainbow House not only provides immediate shelter to LGBTQIA+ people experiencing, but they also offer therapy, housing assistance, and caseworkers to support their clients in any way they need.

Bartlett Housing Solutions provides permanent housing for those in need, as well as support services to help them regain control over their lives and health.

We are proud to have supported these non-profits in our community and will continue to do so in any way we can. Knowing that our beds will be appreciated and well-used is a great feeling, especially considering how expensive they can


### **Meal Program**
